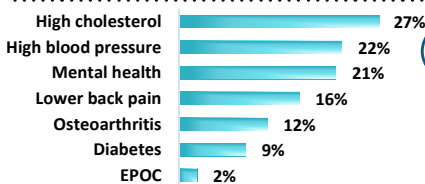

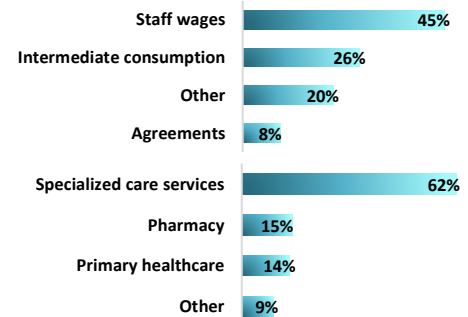
Private
